A Resolution Calling For a Special Census of the Citizens of the  
Town of Spring Hill

WHEREAS, it is the belief of the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Spring Hill that the Town has had a significant growth in its population since the 1990 federal census; AND


WHEREAS, up to two citywide special censuses may be conducted at any time between federal censuses per decade AND


WHEREAS, a significant increase in population could greatly enhance the revenue resources for the Town of Spring Hill,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee, that a special citywide census be conducted of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee, in accordance with the "Procedures for Taking Special Censuses for Population Certification" established by the Local Planning Assistance Office (LPAO) of the Tennessee Department of Economic And Community Development, with the results to be presented to the LPAO for certification.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city's budget for fiscal year 1995-96 shall be amended to include funds as needed to pay for the special census project. Fund allocation is to be determined at a later date.
