
WHEREAS, the counties and municipality agree with the concept of and necessity for Hazard Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee Division of Emergency Management has conducted a review of the Hazard Mitigation Plan; and


NOW, THEREFORE, this document shall hereby approve the Maury County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan as submitted.




