**WHEREAS**, Spring Hill's Police department is currently outfitted with GM vehicles and Spring Hill wishes to continue this tradition; and




**WHEREAS**, Spring Hill seeks solutions for future sedan/crossover PPV options to be manufactured by General Motors.


