SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE, RESCINDING THE MAYOR'S LETTER DATED
JANUARY 24, 2025 REGARDING AN ELECTION COMMISSION MATTER**

WHEREAS, a letter was sent by the Mayor of Spring Hill to Judge Caleb Bayless regarding a Maury County Election Commission matter; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen wishes to establish that said letter does not represent the official position of the City of Spring Hill; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen deems it appropriate for the City to maintain a neutral position on matters under the jurisdiction of the Maury County Election Commission;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE:

Section 1. The letter dated January 24, 2025 sent to Judge Caleb Bayless regarding the Maury County Election Commission matter is hereby rescinded and nullified.

Section 2. The official position of the City of Spring Hill regarding this matter shall be one of neutrality.


Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen.



I write to you today as the Mayor of Spring Hill. I learned over the past few days that one of my constituents, Ms. Kimberly Hughes, was denied the opportunity to run for elected office. This denial as I understand it, was because of a computer error which put her in the wrong ward.

Ms. Hughes turned in her original petition to qualify to be on the ballot long before petitions were due. She was then informed by the Maury County Election Commission AFTER the submission that she did qualify. The timing of this information did not allow her to reset. My ask of you is that you allow her to be put back on the ballot for the ward that she lives in, which is Ward 4.
