**RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE OF NEED FOR AN  
AMBULATORY SURGERY CENTER IN SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE**

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of Spring Hill, Tennessee, deserve access to quality healthcare services within their community; and

**WHEREAS**, the establishment of an Ambulatory Surgery Center in Spring Hill would enhance the healthcare infrastructure, improve healthcare outcomes, and promote the general welfare of the residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tennessee Certificate of Need (CON) approval standards prioritize the need for healthcare facilities and services based on criteria such as population demographics, existing healthcare resources, and the potential impact on access to care; and

**WHEREAS**, the population growth and demographic trends in Spring Hill and surrounding areas indicate a clear need for additional healthcare facilities to adequately serve the community; and

**WHEREAS**, the absence of an Ambulatory Surgery Center in Spring Hill results in residents having to travel significant distances for critical medical care, leading to delays in treatment, increased healthcare costs, and decreased patient satisfaction; and

**WHEREAS**, Spring Hill is home to a highly skilled and talented workforce, including an abundance of healthcare professionals who desire to work within their own community and care for their neighbors; and

**WHEREAS**, the issuance of a Certificate of Need for an Ambulatory Surgery Center in Spring Hill aligns with the objectives of the Tennessee CON program to ensure the efficient use of healthcare resources and the provision of essential services to underserved areas.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND  
ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE;**


