



New Resident Solid Waste and Recycling Information

Effective September 18, 2020



Welcome to Spring Hill! The Utility Billing Department for the City of Spring Hill is responsible for the billing of monthly water, sewer, garbage, recycling and storm water fees for Spring Hill residents and businesses.

Garbage service is contracted through **Waste Management**. The fee is \$10.64 per month and will appear on your monthly bill.

Garbage is picked up curbside weekly. Your container should be placed at the street no later than 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled pick-up day. You are responsible for buying your own garbage container, no larger than 96 gallons. If you have a Homeowner's Association (HOA), we recommend checking with the HOA before you purchase a garbage container

to see if they have any restrictions.

If your garbage is missed, please notify **Waste Management** at (615) 831-9600 or (800) 607-9509 as soon as possible. Only garbage in a container will be picked up. **No medical waste, no chemical waste, no paint cans, no dead animals, and no furniture or appliances will be picked up.** A maximum of 10 containers per residence will be picked up. Garbage containers may be leased from Waste Management by calling (615) 831-9600.

Recycling service is also contracted through Waste Management. The recycling fee is \$4.57 per month and will appear on your monthly bill. *You are not required to recycle, but if you choose not to participate you will still be charged the recycling fee each month because recycling is on a City contract.*

One recycling bin will be furnished per residence at no cost. Recycling should be placed at the street no later than 6:00 a.m. on your pickup day, every other week. Household garbage placed in a recycling bin will not be picked up. A list of recyclable items is on the recycle bin, **however effective immediately only plastics #1 and #2 are allowed.**

What is allowed in curbside recycling bins?

- Plastics #1 and #2
- Paper
- Cardboard (*boxes must be disassembled and laid loose in bin*)
- Metal food cans
- Aluminum beverage cans

What is **NOT** allowed in curbside recycling bins?

- Medical Waste: *i.e., plastic tubing, inhalers, bandages, diapers, bags, or any garbage of any kind*
- Needles or "sharps"
- Aerosols of any kind
- "Tanglers", *i.e., rope, cord, chain, clothes hangers, plastic grocery bags, old VHS tapes, Christmas lights...*
basically anything that can get tangled in the recycling system and cause damage to the machinery or the people working in the recycling plant.
- Anything that is not on the "allowed" list above could cause an entire load of recyclables to be diverted to a landfill.
