A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF BODY CAMERAS FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Police Department is replacing its current car camera system with WatchGuard in-car cameras to include body cameras; and

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Police Department request to purchase body cameras for the remaining patrol officers who do not have body cameras; and


WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Police Department request to purchase ten (10) WatchGuard body cameras with license and one (1) transfer station, to be paid for from the police department drug fund; and

WHEREAS, the purchase will be from Computech International, (CTI) from the GSA Contract: GS-35F00186P; and

WHEREAS; City staff has reviewed prior proposals and has made a recommendation to the Budget and Finance Advisory Committee;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Spring Hill authorizes the purchase of ten (10) WatchGuard body cameras and hardware from Computech International (GSA Contract: GS-35F00186P) for a total of \$18,195.00, to be paid for out of the police drug fund, as recommended by the Budget and Finance Advisory Committee on June 4, 2018.

Passed and adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee on the 18th day of June, 2018.





Department Budget Status:

- I. Purpose/Overview: To purchase body cameras for the remaining patrol officers who currently do not have body cameras.
- II. Background Information: The police department is in the process of replacing our existing digital ally in-car camera system with WatchGuard car cameras to include body cameras. We will continue replacing as approved budget allows us to. We recognize the need to outfit patrol officers with body cameras and not wait until funding is available. The remaining car cameras will be replaced when appropriated to do so. We have already purchased 23 car camera system with body cameras. The remaining ten body cameras will outfit all patrol officers. This will be paid for out of the drug fund and purchase from Computech International (GSA Contract: GS-35F00186P)
- III. Financial Impact to Drug Fund Budget. \$18,195.00
- IV. Alternative Options: wait until funding is appropriated.
- V. Staff Recommendations: Purchase body cameras for patrol officers who do not have a camera assigned to them .
