WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill, TN developed a Tourism Council on June 18, 2018 with the adoption of Resolution 18-106; and


WHEREAS, the purpose of the Tourism Council is to serve as an advisory council to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen regarding tourism related properties and matters; and
