

RESOLUTION 21-46A

A RESOLUTION APPROVING RECOMMENDATION OF PROJECTS FOR THE NEIGHBORHOOD SIDEWALK PROGRAM PLAN FOR FY 2021-2022

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen recognized the need to adopt neighborhood sidewalk policies and procedures to address citizen recreation and safety concerns within residential neighborhoods by adopting Resolution 14-25; and


WHEREAS, the City Staff advertised and accepted applications for sidewalks and, in conjunction with the City's Transportation and Advisory Committee, has identified the following sidewalk priorities for fiscal year 2021-2022:

1. Winter Park subdivision - Phase 1 (Weston Lane, Winter Court, Harrison Way) - \$58,600.00
2. Spring Meadow subdivision - \$100,300.00

WHEREAS, the total cost for identified projects would be \$158,900.00 and expensed in the Streets and Highways departmental budget (110-43100-272).


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee, that the above referenced sidewalk projects are authorized to be completed as recommended by the Transportation Advisory Committee for a total cost of \$158,900.00.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this memo is to provide information regarding a resolution to approve selections for sidewalk projects for the FY 2021-2022 Neighborhood Sidewalk Program.

BACKGROUND:

City staff advertised for submissions for the NSP for fiscal year 2021-2022. Five submissions were received, with no matching contributions. All five were evaluated and ranked by staff and a recommendation to fund two of the projects was presented to the Transportation Advisory Committee on February 23, 2021.

Resolution 21-46A:

TAC made the recommendation to approve the following projects and costs:

1. Winter Park subdivision - Phase 1 (Weston Lane, Winter Court, Harrison Way) - \$58,600.00
2. Spring Meadow subdivision - \$100,300.00

Total expense is \$158,900.00. Expenditure will be from line item 110-43100-272 (Streets and Highways – New Sidewalks). (FY 2020-2021 budget for line item 110-43100-272 was \$150,000.00.)

Resolution 21-46B:

Per a request at the BOMA work session on March 1, 2021, an alternate is provided for recommendation to approve the following projects and costs:

1. Haynes Crossing subdivision (south side of Buckner Lane from Monoco Drive to one house past Lona Court) - \$60,600.00
2. Spring Meadow Subdivision - \$100,300.00

Total expense is \$160,900.00. Expenditure will be from line item 110-43100-272 (Streets and Highways – New Sidewalks). (FY 2020-2021 budget for line item 110-43100-272 was \$150,000.00.)



FINANCIAL IMPACT:


If BOMA approves the recommendation of Resolution 21-46A, the budgeted funds for line item 110-43100-272 would need to increase by \$8,900.00 from last year's budget. The total cost would be \$158,900.00.

If BOMA approves the recommendation of Resolution 21-46B, the budgeted funds for line item 110-43100-272 would need to increase by \$10,900.00 from last year's budget. The total cost would be \$160,900.00.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 21-46A or Resolution 21-46B to approve a recommendation of projects for the Neighborhood Sidewalk Program for FY 2021-2022.
