**WHEREAS**, the following vehicles are recommended to be sold at auction (Gov Deals):





**PURPOSE:**

To dispose of older model police vehicles that are no longer in use due to year, mileage, and/or present condition.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Police Department currently has in our inventory, 13 vehicles, that are no longer in condition to operate due to the year, mileage and or maintenance costs. 9 (nine) of the vehicles are Chev Impalas, purchased out of the general fund. 2 (two) of the vehicles were purchased from the Police Department Drug Fund. If approved to dispose, the vehicles will be advertised for sale on Gov. Deals, as we have done in the past.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

\$ 10,000.00 estimated revenue.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 21-59 to allow the police department to dispose of older model vehicles in our fleet by advertising for sale on Gov. Deals.
