**WHEREAS**, the Police Department was approved to purchase Motorola radio system; and

**WHEREAS**, the Police Department request to continue to utilize Motorola radio systems in conjunction with the Williamson County communication systems; and

**WHEREAS**, the Police Department requests to purchase (6) six Motorola APX 6000/6500 radios, and external hardware from Motorola Solutions from State of Tennessee Contract SWC-418, for a total cost of \$33,778.68, to include installation; and

**WHEREAS**, funding will be used from the Police Departments current 2021-2022 fiscal budget.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City of Spring Hill authorizes the Police Department to purchase Motorola APX 6000/6500 radios, software, hardware, and installation from Motorola Solutions, SWC-418, for \$33,778.68.

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**PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this request is to seek approval for the purchase of new Motorola radios for the three new hires that were approved in the current FY 21-22 budget.

**BACKGROUND:**

SHPD utilizes the Williamson County radio system, Motorola 6000/6500 radios. For new hires, the department has to purchase both portable and car radios for them. This is the only option we have, in order for the officers to communicate with dispatch and other officers.
