**A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE A CONTRACT FOR SERVICES WITH
MAURY COUNTY ANIMAL SHELTER**

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill utilizes the services of the Maury County Animal Shelter (MCAS) for its citizens on animal complaints; and

WHEREAS, due to the increase in calls of service and the growth in population, MCAS has requested the City of Spring Hill to provide funding for the service it receives; and

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill agrees to enter into a contract with the MCAS and contribute \$15,000.00 annually to offset expenditures.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Spring Hill agrees to enter into a contract with Maury County Animal Shelter and contribute \$15,000.00 annually to the Shelter for services provided by them.

Passed and adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee on the 7th day of September, 2021.





PURPOSE:

The purpose of Resolution 21-154 is to seek approval for the City of Spring Hill to enter into a contract with annual funding to help offset cost associated with services provided to Spring Hill by the Maury County Animal Shelter. The City of Spring Hill provides funding to the Williamson County Animal Shelter.

BACKGROUND:

Jack Cooper, director of MCAS, met with me to discuss financial support of the shelter. The City of Spring Hill has not funded the animal shelter for the services the residents receive from the shelter. With the increase in calls of service, and the growth of Spring Hill, Maury side, it will benefit the City to assist in funding the shelter, so we will be able to receive full service from the shelter. Mount Pleasant and Columbia fund the shelter annually for the services they receive. This is a budgeted item and if approved by BOMA, the funds are available.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

\$\$15,000.00 annually. Codes budget, line item 293
